## TERMS OF CONDITIONS

**Congratulations, you have just adopted one or more rabbits from our rescue shelter! Below you can read again how we work, what we expect from you as a new owner, and what you can do if you have questions about a rescue rabbit. We hope you will enjoy them very much!**

- We expect new owners to provide the rabbits with a rabbit-worthy high quality rabbit life. This means that they will always live together with a companion of the same species, receive sufficient daily exercise through spacious housing, and be given proper nutrition and, if necessary, appropriate medical care.
- It is not permitted to breed with rabbits adopted from the shelter.
- Should a rabbit adopted from us develops medical problems within two weeks of the adoption, please you can contact us. If necessary, we will make an appointment and take the animal to our vet. We will not reimburse medical costs incurred on your own initiative (with our veterinarian or your own). Konijnenopvang Hillegom will make the decision as to whether the rabbit can be taken to the veterinarian at our expense.
- Bonding rabbits and having your rabbit stay at the shelter is at your own risk. We bond rabbits with the best intentions, experience, and the knowledge we have, but we cannot be held responsible for injuries the rabbits may cause each other. We try of course to prevent injuries, but sometimes it is impossible to predict how rabbits will behave.
- If problems arise at home with the bonding of your rabbit to the shelter rabbit, you may of course contact us. We will help you as best we can with advice to make the bonding successful. If this does not work, we will schedule a new bonding appointment.
- If, for whatever reason, you are no longer able to care for your rabbits, they can be returned to us. This may not be possible immediately depending on how full the shelter is. If there is no space, you will be placed on a waiting list and we will contact you when a place becomes available. We charge a fee to surrender a rabbit.
- Please always feel free to contact us with any questions or concerns you have about your rabbit(s).
